

A DAY OF EMPOWERMENT, FREEDOM, AND A CELEBRATION OF TOGETHERNESS, SISTERHOOD.

Despite the current push to reduce black history, The Critical Race Theory, from the pages of history for all, Eta lota Sigma Chapter finalized their activities devoted Sisterhood to during the month of June. The chapter gathered to honor Juneteenth Day. They learned about the historical significance of the event. to celebrate the and birthday of newly elected Madame Basileus. Soror Jocelyn Route. The gathering took place at Hook and Reel Restaurant Bar Wheaton. and in Maryland on Monday, June

Ten Sorors and our Rhoer, Nyah Johnson enjoyed eating various types of fish combination platters, conversing, and having fun. Our educational session, referring to the historical aspects of Juneteenth was presented in a question-and-answer game. In addition, the question-and-answer

session included content related to black history, political science, and social justice. Sorors won traveling cups with Juneteenth slogans as prizes, and Soror Brewster-Johnson gave all who attended Juneteenth lapel pins.





The following questions were presented by Soror Jessica Brewster-Johnson:

- · Who is the first African American Supreme Court Justice?
- The question arose what are the true colors and meaning of the Juneteenth Flag?

The Juneteenth holiday represents the "freedom" of all slaves who still endured the bonds of slavery in 1865 in the state of Texas. The proclamation of freedom was delivered by Union General Gordon Granger. The significance of this proclamation is that these slaves were still forced to remain working under the harsh conditions of slavery for three years after President Lincoln had signed the Emancipation Proclamation, on January 1, 1863.

We learned that the Juneteenth flag is blue and red with a white flower silhouette.

In addition, we were introduced to two black-owned businesses: showoffbyaslee.com, and Fia's Fabulous Finds. Madame Basileus shared with us that her cousin's website: showoffbyaslee.com displays makeup products for all women of color. The website did have special discounts related to the Juneteenth holiday.

Furthermore, Madame Basileus, described the second company, Fia's Fabulous Finds as a company that "offers upscale, quality, brand-name ladies' clothing, and accessories in new and nearly-new condition at prices significantly below department store levels."

The Soror who owns the company provided us with her testimony on how she and her business survived the COVID-19 shutdown. She proudly suggests that all should "Visit us for an exciting and firstclass shopping experience." This consignment shop has clothing for all ages and sizes. She specializes in women's clothing between the sizes of small to 4x. The Soror/owner mentioned that she could consider a section of the inventory to be devoted to Sigma Gamma Rho with the help of the Eta lota Sigma chapter. The shop already has a section that is devoted to another sorority. The Soror's store information is below.

OPERATION BIG BOOKBAG RECAP

OPERATION BIGBOOKBAG is an annual Community Service project initiated by Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Inc. across the country and internationally. **This** community service project was developed and initiated in 1996 under the direction of 18 International Grand Basileus. Dr. LaRona J. Morris. The project was designed to and supply resources educational items for students who are in under-served communities that have limited academic resources.

This academic-based project can be held twice a year: August and January of the school year. Currently, this project has expanded academic mission to include mentorship, tutoring, and that focus events on introducing Science. Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) to the community.



Operation BigBook Bag truly demonstrates of one Sorority's missions: Sisterhood, Scholarship, and Community Service. The members of Eta lota Sigma Alumnae Chapter of Chevy Chase, Maryland began centennial their vear of community service events by preparing for Operation Big BookBaa. This community service event began on the humble steps of sorors' homes including the stacked boxes of Amazon Bulk school supplies and transitioned to the tents on the grounds of the Bladensburg Community Center Bladensburg, Maryland.

The members of Eta lota Sigma Chapter began their centennial sorority year with Sisterhood promoting Academic Excellence through Operation Big Book Bag by donating several school supplies, snacks, raffling six laptops, and providing the community of Bladensburg with approximately 1, 000 backpacks on Saturday, August 20, 2022. In addition, there was a diaper giveaway. Moreover, affiliates of the chapter: Rhoers (pictured below, Maya Lockett, and Nyla Johnson, present but not pictured) and Philo member, Clara Chapman were present to assist in the distribution of all items. The sponsors of the event presented the mission statements and purposes of their community-based organizations: Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority Inc. Eta lota Sigma Chapter, No Opportunity Wasted Foundation (NOW), Exit Landmark Realtor Crystal Alexandria, and City of Bladensburg Council Member Jocelyn Route.





In addition to promoting items for educational enhancement. one of the sponsors provided 300 packs of diapers to the community. The event was accepted by well the community, and throughout the morning one could observe the community's excitement and appreciation. Special thank you and much appreciation to all sorors who donated items, and their time in community service. "STRIVING FOR EXCELLENCE TOGETHER" AT THE ETA IOTA SIGMA CHAPTER EXECUTIVE BOARD RETREAT

The newly elected and appointed officers of Eta Iota Sigma Chapter of Sigma Gamma Rho, Sorority, Inc. for the year 2022-2023 bonded in sisterhood for an executive board meeting and retreat. This business retreat focused on leadership training and mentorship. The retreat occurred on July 30, 2022, and was held at the renovated Zena Hotel in Washington, D. C. According to Madame Basileus, the meeting room and luncheon were made possible with the help of Soror Misty Johnson Oratokha, Esq. The retreat was conducted using a hybrid model. The executive board members discussed the aualifications and duties of each elected and appointed office. All members presented their individual thoughts and ideas with professional poise, and confidence to collectively develop a chapter's mission statement.

The content of the chapter's mission statement encompassed the concept of inclusion that addresses the multigenerational membership of the chapter. Soror Jocelyn Route (Madame Basileus) facilitated and lead the business retreat. The gaenda focused on reviewing all elected and appointed officers' positions: **Basileus** (Soror Jocelyn Route), 1st Anti-Basileus (Soror Jessica Brewster-Johnson, Esa.). 2nd Anti-Basileus (Soror Alisha R. Brown, Mu Omega), 3rd Anti-Basileus (Soror Dr. LaKeesha Easterling, Strayer University), **Anti-Grammateus** (Soror Melissa Braga-Lockett), **Grammateus** (Soror Kimberly Blair), Tamiochus (Soror Raishawn Walston), and **Epistoleus** (Soror Venerable-Joyner). The following appointed positions were present to include Chaplain (Soror K. Ford), **Parliamentarian** (Soror Misty Johnson Oratokha, Esq.), and Sargent-of-Arms (Soror Sherri Grimes).

Additional discussions focused on providing names of candidates who would fill the vacant committee chairpersons and other appointed positions such as the Member representative of the Montgomery County National Panhellenic Council (NPHC) Representative, Program Coordinator, and Rhoer Coordinator. The following position was acknowledged, The National Panhellenic Counsel President position which will be filled by Soror Tanna Crumbley-Hassan.





The retreat resulted in finalizing all annual sorority-related chapter activities such as Swim 2020, Operation Big Book Bag, Little Soles for Little Feet, and Women's Health Initiative for the year. Sorors further enjoyed their retreat with an excellent, tasty lunch. The lunch menu included: Roasted Tomato Bisque, Local Filed of Mixed Greens and Ranch or Balsamic Dressing, and Russian Fingerling Potato Salad (Alliums, Herbs De Provence/Stone Ground Mustard). The sandwiches included a selection of grilled chicken with oven-dried tomatoes, spinach, red onion, turkey bacon, mozzarella, and pesto aioli; roasted portabella with piquillo peppers, charred eggplant, alfalfa sprouts, and edamame hummus, and the third sandwich included, seafood salad, poached shrimp, celery, onions, dill, and lemon. The desserts included: ricotta and pistachio cake, fragoline strawberry tart, and red velvet cake.

The retreat displayed the process of individualization melding into a collective body for the greater development and growth of the chapter. The various qualities and styles of leadership were demonstrated throughout the meeting. These various styles of leadership and qualities are reflected in this poem that was written in the historical book of Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority:
